# Sustainability Walking Tours

Join local planners, architects, developers, students and other planning professionals on one of two spectacular walking tours.

1. **¡Tijuana!** Discover the plans for the new San Ysidro Port of Entry from both sides of the U.S./Mexico border – The busiest land border crossing in the world. Hear about Tijuana’s Bus Rapid Transit Plans and see their new Ciclovías (Bike Paths). Learn about the city’s plans to develop an iconic main plaza (Zócalo) near the existing City Hall. Walk through the new bustling arts scene on Revolución Avenue. Dine at the historic renovated “Ceasar’s” Restaurant – Home of the original Ceasar salad. Stroll through pedestrian plazas, innovative architectural buildings, markets, and much more.

2. **Cavallo Point/Historic Sausalito** From military post to a world class destination, Fort Baker has been transformed into a resort focusing on local food, health and sustainability. Come enjoy Cavallo Point's spectacular views, distinctive architecture and beautiful grounds. Tour members will also learn about how a public-private partnership preserved historic buildings and provided for their adaptive reuse. Participants will also visit historic Sausalito - and check out the sights and sounds of its magnificent waterfront, houseboats and interesting cultural heritage.
