Navy Region Southwest is implementing several initiatives to implement the Secretary of the Navy's energy goals to increase warfighting capability, both strategically and tactically. The Navy's energy strategy is centered on energy security, energy efficiency, and environmental stewardship while remaining the pre-eminent maritime power. By proactively working with land use agencies to establish compatible Policies and coordinating the review of proposed development with local governmental jurisdictions, the Navy is promoting land uses compatible with the military mission in areas with renewable energy resources.

California Governor Brown's Energy Goals requires public and private utilities to obtain 33 percent of their electricity from renewable energy sources by 2020. The Department of the Navy is coordinating efforts with local jurisdictions in California to create compatible land uses where there is a potential for renewable energy projects. In addition, the Department of Defense is coordinating efforts with the CA Office of Planning and Research for outreach efforts.
